



PRAY — The opening Psalm for this Sunday is Psalm 119:49-56. After reading the Psalm be encouraged to take a couple of minutes to meditate on these 7 points. 1. We pray the Lord remembers His promise to us. 2. In this promise there is hope, comfort, and life eternal. 3. In affliction or scorn we focus on the goodness of the Lords law free from negative distractions. 4. Be doubly comforted that the Lord is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow; forever unchanging. 5. Be pained by lawlessness. 6. Sing songs of praise to His righteousness. And 7. Remember the Lords name in the night, Christian, and be thankful for the blessing to do all the good that our Lord wills.

Sermon Title: 'The Demise of Death'

Sermon Text: Hebrews 2:14-15

Hebrews 2:14-15

Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, he himself likewise partook of the same things, that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery. (ESV)

1 John 4:2-3

By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you heard was coming and now is in the world already. (ESV)

Romans 4:22-25

That is why his faith was "counted to him as righteousness." But the words "it was counted to him" were not written for his sake alone, but for ours also. It will be counted to us who believe in him who raised from the dead Jesus our Lord, who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification. (ESV)

Romans 5:17-21

For if, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ. Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous. Now the law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. (ESV)

Colossians 2:13-15

And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him. (ESV)

Acts 2:24

God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. (ESV)

Revelation 1:17-18

When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he laid his right hand on me, saying, "Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades. (ESV)

John 5:21

For as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, so also the Son gives life to whom he will. (ESV)

2 Timothy 1:10
